

#### Resource Needs Assessment Program Overview

#### **CHALLENGES TODAY**

- ✓ Resource data are not necessarily current or readily available to <u>share</u> with stakeholders
- ✓ Strategic conservation <u>planning</u> is inhibited
- ✓ Actively <u>collaborating</u> across jurisdictional boundaries is hard to achieve
- ✓ <u>Showing</u> the impact of shared priorities and investments in mitigation work is not possible because we lack a consistent, statewide mechanism for tracking accomplishments
